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Types of Sessions

Choose the best option for your proposal.

- Breakout Sessions: 60 minutes
 - Designed to share knowledge and best practices. Share your topic, its relevance to teacher-powered, and a detailed description of how you will use the time.
- Panel of Experts: 60 minutes
 - Panels can be coordinated by an organization or school. Each expert will be given time to share their research and relevant experience, and there should be time allotted for questions. Share your topic and individuals you will ask to participate.
- Roundtable Discussions: 60 minutes
 - Led by teacher-powered practitioners and support experts in small groups (no more than 15 people). Share the topic you would like to discuss, including talking points and questions you will ask the group.

Intended Audiences

In the past, we have separated audience groups and teams in a variety of stages of teacher-powered. Not this year. We have learned that our sessions apply to *all* educators and teams, at a variety of stages, because the cycles of improvement require everyone to revisit the basics of autonomies and practices—and hear ideas that push our knowledge of what we know is possible.
